Sharon served at Calvary Hill Baptist Church and later joined Bridge City Church, volunteering in several of its ministries.

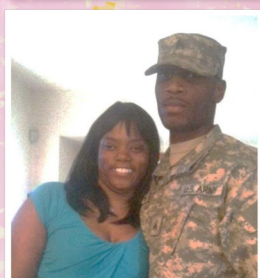
